Those riders not participating in Part One will stage at the grave site to be briefed, set flags and await the arrival of the procession. Riders in the procession will quickly dismount and join the flag line. Riders will stand tall and silent until the completion of the service, after which flags will be returned to the flag support vehicle. Riders will then be debriefed and dismissed.

NOTE: Time of arrival at cemetery is approximate

PGR participation will include serving as pallbearers.

If you choose to fly a flag on your bike you are SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for ensuring it is secured and not a danger to any other rider or traffic.

High Temperatures

It's every RIDER'S PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY to hydrate prior to attending a mission.

Begin drinking water the night before. Drink water when you wake up and continue drinking water all day to ensure your body stays hydrated.
