PGR will stage at the Visitor Center for a briefing. Honor bikes will be selected, and all others will proceed to the assigned shelter to set flags and await the arrival of Mr. Botello, his family and friends. We will stand tall and silent during the committal service.

The Certificate of Appreciation will be presented at the shelter. At the conclusion of the service, flags will be returned to the storage locker. Following the post-mission briefing, riders will be dismissed.

High Temperatures

It's every RIDER'S PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY to hydrate prior to attending a mission.

Begin drinking water the night before. Drink water when you wake up and continue drinking water all day to ensure your body stays hydrated.
